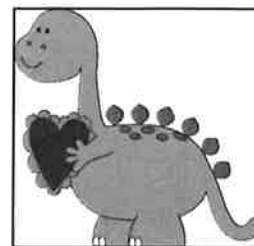

BLOCK WATCH

“CREATING SAFER NEIGHBORHOODS ONE BLOCK AT A TIME”

Scam Alert – Suspect Impersonating YCSO personnel

Suspects identifying themselves as a deputy from the Yavapai County Sheriff’s Office call a victim indicating they have a warrant for failing to appear regarding jury duty. They will attempt to confirm the victim’s correct social security number, date of birth and home address. The quality of the information provided by the suspect makes the exchange more believable to the victim thus heightening concern.

The suspect provides a bogus court case number, his contact phone number with a 928 area code, instructs the victim to appear in person at the Cottonwood Municipal Court at a specific time when the court is closed. The suspect then expects a follow-up call from the victim after finding the court closed and then directs them to pay a fine via green dot/gift card/money order to quash the warrant.

These scammers often are able to obtain complete personal data on individuals from hackers who routinely sell such information via underground websites. **IF IN DOUBT, VERIFY ANY CLAIM BY CONTACTING THE COURT/ SHERIFF’S OFFICE/POLICE DEPARTMENT USING PUBLISHED PHONE NUMBERS.** Also note that scam suspects are able to spoof phone numbers which appear on caller ID screens as authentic to the government agency. This can make a scam call seem genuine.

REMEMBER, LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES and COURT OFFICIALS WILL NEVER CALL TO SOLICIT PAYMENT ON A WARRANT IN THIS MANNER.

NAMES USED BY SUSPECTS IN THESE CALLS MAY OR MAY NOT REPRESENT A TRUE PERSON- EITHER WAY THESE CALLS ARE ALWAYS FRAUDULENT!

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A-C NEWS FOR YOU – Permits & Rules

Yellow Permits -When your project is approved by the Architectural Committee (A-C) you are given a yellow paper (8"x10.5"), which is your Villages Permit. This paper is important for it lets the community know that you are doing a legitimate project, and it also lets the A-C know when you are done. So, when you are given this **Yellow Permit**, you are to put it in a street-side window (or place it so it can be seen from the street). *If you have a Town of Prescott Valley building permit, place the 2 permits next to each other. When your project is done, please fill out the back of the Yellow Permit and sign it, then turn it in to the office – so we will know you are done.*

RFC New Items – The Request For Change form has a couple of new items added to it: 1) There is a section for the Town of Prescott Valley to fill out, **if you are doing any kind of construction**. *We will NOT approve any construction project without this information.* The Town will provide the Permit Number and signature of the Town engineer. If a permit *is not* necessary, the Town will indicate that and also sign off for us. 2) The graph paper included is slightly different. You may use 1 square to equal 2 or 3 feet. *Please include your street in your drawing, and include ALL buildings on your lot – even if you are doing a shed or landscaping. We need a full lot perspective to understand what you intend to do. Also, don't forget to label items on your drawing.*

New A-C Rules– You have probably heard rumors that there are some new rules for the Architectural Committee (A-C) to go by. Here's the "skinny" on that: The A-C has been reviewing the "Architectural Committee Rules & Regulations" for the purpose of improvement and simplification. While some rules have been *designated* for change and some have been *recommended* to be added or subtracted, none of them have been ratified by the HOA Board yet. When that happens you will be notified of what the new rules and changes are. In the meantime, we will continue with the current Rules as before.

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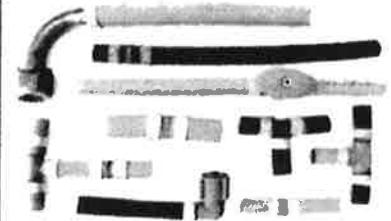

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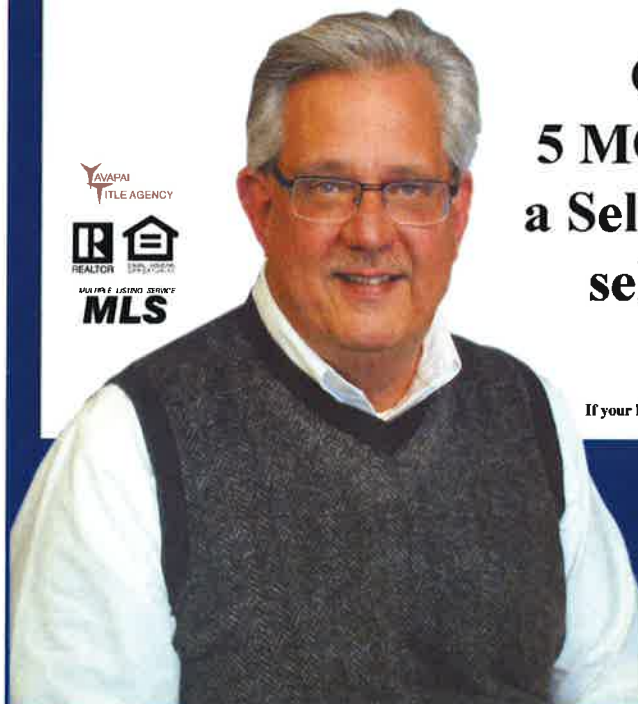
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
