## BLOCK WATCH

“Creating Safer Neighborhoods One Block at a Time”

### Basic Fire Evacuation Procedures, Part II

As indicated in the previous article, evacuation process is the responsibility of Yavapai County Sheriff Office (YCSO), Prescott Valley PD (PVPD), and other law enforcement agencies, assisted by trained volunteers.

Communities are divided into manageable areas, which will be assigned to teams from above agencies. They will notify residents of evacuation actions they should take, evacuation route and the shelter they need to report to. The actions may be advanced notice of a pending evacuation, prepare for evacuation or evacuate immediately.

Once you have been notified to evacuate, the notifying unit will attach orange tape somewhere visible on your property. You will be asked to hang a white cloth or towel in a location visible from the road when you leave. This will tell responders that you have evacuated and prevent the duplication of effort.

**Departure from the area:** Do not deviate from the route given; it will be the safest route and will allow access for emergency vehicles. Once you leave you may not be allowed to return. Law enforcement will provide security for evacuated areas.

**Registration:** Everyone must proceed to the indicated registration area, whether you intend to stay there or not. This allows responders to know you have evacuated and enables the Red Cross to inform family and friends you are safe.

**Re-entry:** Is allowed as soon as safety permits, which may be delayed due to other dangers besides fire. Your safety far outweighs the inconvenience of being evacuated.

## **A-C\* NEWS FOR YOU: A Community of Peace & Beauty**

February 2018 is here already! Spring is just around the corner and the good weather for landscaping, repairing homes, and generally making improvements to our homes and lots, will be upon us. Everyone benefits from our lot improvements, for it shows pride in our community and improves our property values.

**As a reminder**, as you plan your home improvement projects on the *outside of your homes* here; don't forget to submit a **"Request For Change"** to the **\*Architectural Committee (A-C)**, available at the Villages' office. **We will be glad to help you so that your plans are fulfilled and yet comply with the CC&Rs.** You may also need to get a **city permit** from the Town of Prescott Valley for some construction projects.

**Don't' forget** to consider the **legal setbacks** from property lines, and **easements** – check your copy of the **"Architectural Committee Rules"** and the **CC&Rs**. Also, your structures (house, carport/garage, patio/deck and porch covers) may have a **total roof coverage of no more than 50% of your lot's square footage (you can measure the footprint of your buildings to figure the square footage of your structures).**

**Also**, your **yellow Villages Permit** must be mounted where it can be seen from the street during the time you are doing your project(s). When finished, please sign and **RETURN** the **yellow Villages Permit** to the office.

The A-C meets **every 1<sup>st</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesdays at 9:00 a.m.**, in the Card Room. You are welcome to come and ask questions or observe.

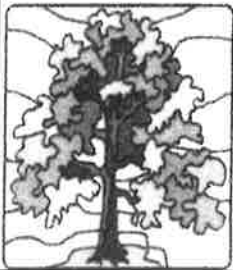

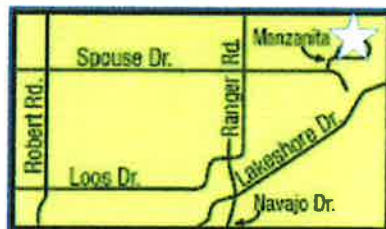

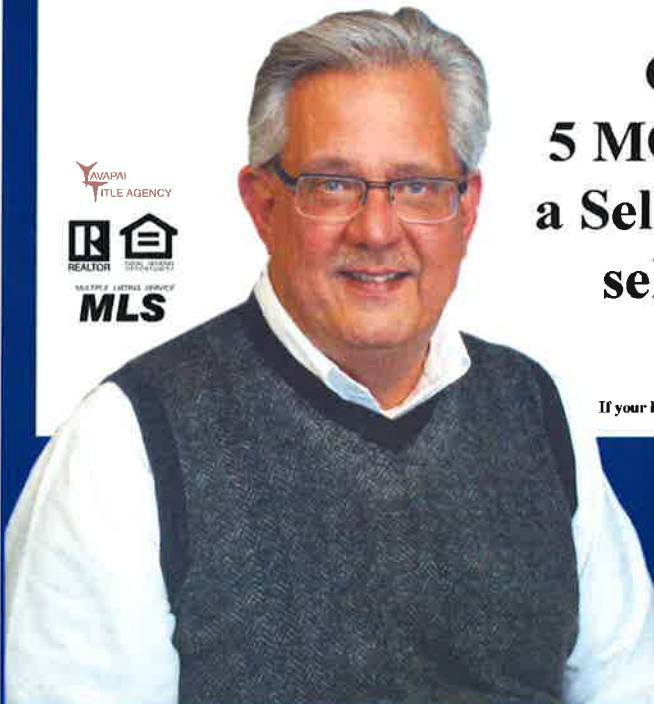
