

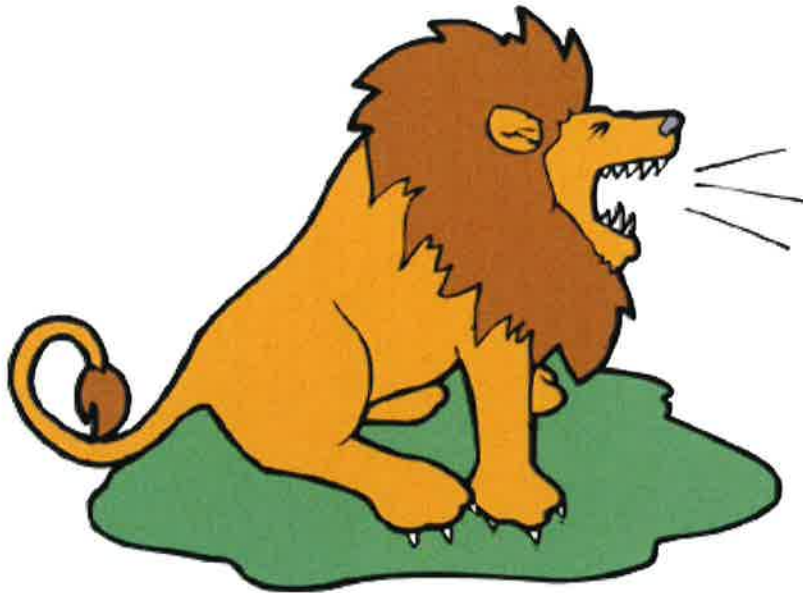

**"In like a lion,  
out like a lamb?"**

For most locations, the average temperature at the end of the month is higher than at the beginning, and the weather is usually "milder" or more calm at the end so the proverb typically has some meteorological truth to it, but where did it come from?


The phrase apparently has its origins with the constellations Leo (the Lion) and Aries, (the ram or lamb). It has to do with the relative positions of these constellations in the sky at the beginning and end of the month.

## ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE NEWS

### "WHAT ABOUT THE RFC??"

*By Rick for the Architectural Committee*

Well, spring is here which means outdoor improvements on our lots will begin. Some of the improvements we home-owners want done are, as they say, "Beyond our pay grade" to do. So we hire a handyman or a professional to do the work.

Either way, whether we do the work ourselves or hire someone to do it for us, we need to remember that the work still needs to be in compliance with the HOA rules, and that we home-owners are the ones responsible for how the work is done and for the end results. If *the end result* is not in compliance then the project will not be approved at the end of the project, and the home-owner will be advised of the problem (not correcting the problem can result in fines until the project is corrected). Please check your copy of the CC&Rs for further understanding on this matter.

Also, it is very important to *fill out* the *Request For Change (RFC)* form with as much information as you can. Also, the home-owner must sign the Request For Change (RFC) form and see to it that it is turned in at the Front Office. It is strongly recommended that the home-owner attend the next meeting after the RFC is turned in. **HOWEVER**, if the home-owner needs someone to speak for him/her at the Committee meeting (*which is held on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesdays of each month in the Card Room, at 9:00 A.M.*), a signed and dated letter must be submitted to the Architectural Committee designating that "So-and-so" (a family member, contractor or handyman) has permission to represent you. Then the Committee will discuss your project with your designated representative. This is to protect the home-owner and his/her privacy. So, please do not send your designated representative to the Committee to represent you *without* having provided the Committee with this letter. Having said the above, *everyone is welcome to the Architectural Committee meetings* to observe and/or to ask questions.

We thank you for your kind cooperation with our HOA rules in home improvement. That makes our whole community better.
