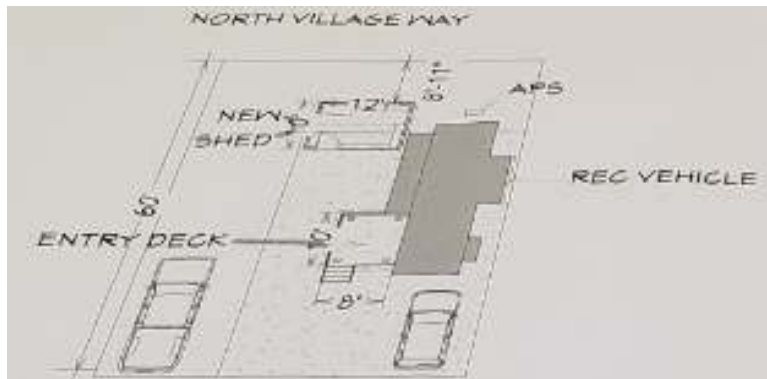


ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE NEWS

“And The Prize Goes To ... ”

Oh, if only we could give out awards for neatness and clarity of projects proposed on our *Request For Change* forms! If we could, the one pictured below would certainly qualify to get a 10' Loving Cup. While we don't expect this type of *professional sketches, hand drawings are definitely acceptable* as long as they come with locations of buildings on the lot and where you want the project to be. Include the street location and the dimensions of what you want to construct – *these are all essential information* for us. AND, clarity and neatness goes a l-o-n-g way in helping us to understand what you want to do. The picture below is only used as *an example*, but it IS a professionally done drawing; which, while it is nice, it is quite rare here.



Remember, your projects come to us from YOUR perspective, and it's up to you to bring us along with you so that we are “on the same page” as you.

These sketches are important for any type of construction, including fences, raised gardens, flower boxes, privacy screens, and etc.

Some projects, such as new roofing, painting, and etc., do not need a SKETCH, but do need a *Request For Change*. We also need, for painting, a paint sample on a piece of wood, and the Paint I.D. and Number. The paint looks different on paper or cardboard than it does on wood or house siding. We have gotten ourselves into trouble in the past for approving paint colors on paper, and then found out it looked different on the house.

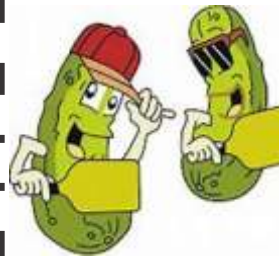

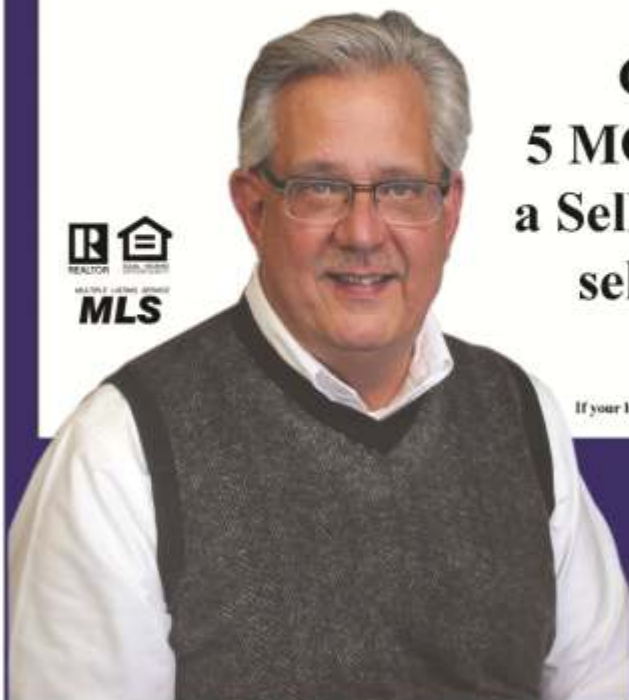

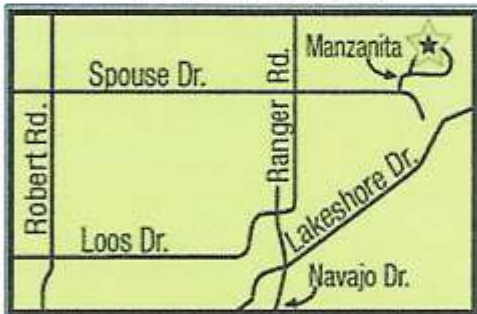
