
Notes from the Board

Kelley Lauer is the new Financial Officer at The Villages. She comes to us from Maltby a small town in western Washington about thirty miles northeast of Seattle. She knew she didn't want to live in the Valley heat, so she was driving around checking out this area when she saw the trees in Prescott and "that did it." That was ten years ago.

Prior to moving here Kelley received her Associates degree in Accounting plus a two year Certificate in Computer Programming through Sno-Isle Tech. She has worked for over twenty years and is a certified full-charge bookkeeper through AIPB, the American Institute of Professional

Bookkeepers. She specializes in setting up and transferring accounting systems. With her computer background she can easily go back and forth between computer programs.




ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE NEWS

"And The Prize Goes To ... "

Oh, if only we <u>could</u> give out awards for neatness and clarity of projects proposed on our *Request For Change* forms! If we could, the one <u>pictured below</u> would certainly qualify to get a 10' Loving Cup. While we don't expect this type of *professional* sketches, *hand drawings are definitely acceptable* as long as they come with <u>locations of buildings on the lot and where you want the project to be</u>. Include <u>the street location and the dimensions of what you want to construct</u> – *these are all essential information* for us. AND, <u>clarity and neatness</u> goes a l-o-n-g way in helping us to understand what you want to do. The <u>picture below</u> is only used as *an example*, but it IS a professionally done drawing; which, while it is nice, it is quite rare here.



Remember, your projects come to us from YOUR perspective, and it's up to you to bring us along with you so that we are "on the same page" as you.

These sketches are important <u>for any type of construction</u>, including fences, raised gardens, flower boxes, privacy screens, and etc.

Some projects, such as new roofing, painting, and etc., do <u>not</u> need a SKETCH, but <u>do</u> <u>need a Request For Change</u>. We also need, for painting, <u>a paint sample on a piece of wood</u>, and the <u>Paint I.D. and Number</u>. The paint looks different on paper or cardboard than it does on wood or house siding. We have gotten ourselves into trouble in the past for approving paint colors on paper, and then found out it looked different on the house.
