## **Board of Directors Election Update**

Almost 200 ballots were picked up in the office through Friday, June 11. The remaining ballots were mailed out to their respective addresses of record on Monday, June 14.

Ballots may be returned via regular mail or in person to the HOA office on or before July 14.

The quorum for voting is 25% of ballots (113.5), as required by our CC&Rs. If this quorum is not met, the current board remains in place, until another election results in a quorum.

Here are the answers to several questions about this election:

-There were only three candidates who applied before the May 12 deadline: Steve Breyer, Al Myers, and Luci Salas. These candidates were vetted, and the ballots were prepared. On May 27, Luci resigned from the board. **There would have been additional costs to reprint the ballots.** Her name still appears on the ballot, but votes cast for her will not be counted.

- -Our bylaws do not allow for write-ins, nor proxy voting, nor cumulative voting.
- -Although there are three open positions on the board, only two candidates remain in the running, and **the election must go on**. Even though it may seem that we don't need to vote, the election must still be held and the votes counted and the election results documented in order to maintain our status as a non-profit organization.
- -Ballots that contain only 2 or 1 or even 0 votes still count toward the quorum.

Ballots received by 11 a.m. on July 14 will be counted in the Activity Room by a group of volunteers, with the plan of completing the count before the Annual Meeting starts. If anyone has not submitted their ballot before the Annual Meeting, they will be given the opportunity to do so if present at the Annual Meeting. The results will be announced at that time.

## Architectural Committee News

Why do we have an Architecture Committee? That is a good question that all of the residents of the Villages at Lynx Creek should ask. The easy answer is that the Declarations of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions (CC&R) requires it. However, each of us should reflect first on why did we decide to invest in a home in this specific community. Was it because we were seeking new friends, an active lifestyle, new recreation opportunities, etc.? From the architectural Committee perspective the Mission Statement in the architectural rules states it.

The purpose of these rules is to ensure that our community remains a pleasant place in which to live and that all homeowners benefit from these construction standards which will enhance our home appearances and maintain our property values.

To achieve that objective each of us need to take responsibility for our part in achieving that objective. I would expand on that to say the mission of the Architectural Committee is to assist homeowners to understand how the rules are applied to changes they make to their property. Our objective is to work with the homeowners to help them achieve their objectives within the architectural rules.

Having said that, What responsibilities should the homeowner reflect on and make a commitment to follow through on? Here's what the Architectural Rules say.

#### Owner Responsibilities:

It is the responsibility of the lot owner to make a formal "Request for Change" on the proper forms available at the Villages' office and submit them to the Architectural Committee BEFORE starting any "improvements" on their lot or making any "exterior" alterations" as these terms are described below.



"Exterior alterations" means any construction, installation, addition, alteration, change, change of color, demolition or other work that alters the exterior appearance of structures on a lot or the improvements there on.

"Improvements" means any dwelling, building, fence, wall, raised bed for planting or other structures with an above ground profile, a driveway or parking area and landscaping improvements. Landscaping improvements include trees, plants, shrubs, or other landscaping improvements of every type or kind, such as artificial grass. No approval is needed for small shrubs planted and maintained to be three (3) feet tall or less, flowers or other plantings, yard decorations under four (4) feet and Christmas decorations.

The members of the Architectural Committee are here to help you achieve your overall objectives you had when you made the decision to live here. Please contact any of us when you are considering making improvements to your home.

## **Emergency Evacuation Procedure Presentation**

Yavapai County Jeep Posse (YCJP) President/Capt., L.W. (Bill) Hager, will give a presentation on Emergency Evacuation procedures.

The (YCJP) Search and Rescue has been around since 1952 and is trained in fire evacuation and is a first responder for fire notifications as directed by the Yavapai County Sheriff's Office (YCSO). As a Sheriff's Auxiliary the YCJP trains for fire evacuations and have detailed maps for use in 26 high risk areas. They have excellent communications and mapping capabilities onboard and a Forward Communications Vehicle (FCV) that can support the Sheriff's efforts on fire as well as search and rescue.
