There will be a HOA Workshop Meeting on Thursday, June 3, and also the regular Owners-HOA Board Meeting on Thursday, June 17, both at 2:30 p.m. in the Social Hall.

Also included in with the ballot is the HOPA (Housing for Older Persons Act) age certification form. In order to retain our status as a 55+ community, the HOA is obligated to periodically survey all residents (owners and tenants) to determine that we meet the statute requirements. You may return this form separately or include it with your ballot. Office personnel will follow up to determine that we have an age certification form for each lot.

A few residents have expressed their disagreement with the restrictions and obligations of our governing documents (Bylaws, CC&Rs, Rules & Regulations, Architectural Committee Rules). Living in The Villages is not just sitting back and enjoying our amenities. There are also rules to follow, so that all of us are assured that the common areas, our property values, and our relationships with our neighbors continue to make this a great place to live.

When you chose to live here in The Villages, you also chose the HOA and its governing documents. If you would like to review these documents yourself, you may go to our website (villagesatlynxcreek.com) or contact the HOA office to obtain a copy. These documents have been around since the beginning of The Villages, although there have been revisions since then.

Some people like living in a HOA community, and some don't. You have options on where you choose to live. We hope you choose to live here and abide by our governing documents.

CANDIDATE INFORMATION

The candidates are listed in alphabetical order, and their information was supplied by themselves.

Steve Breyer

I have been a resident here for 6 years, and I am currently President of the HOA Board of Directors. Previously, I was a licensed general contractor for 25 years. I also was the manager of customer service for two new home builders for several years. My responsibilities included department budgets, employee management, contract oversight, and general warranty repair operations. I would like to continue the work on improvements that the Board has made thus far.

Al Myers

I have lived here for the past 4 years. I previously worked in the legal department at Ashland Oil. As current Vice President of the HOA Board of Directors, I was responsible for managing the Fain Project, including the receipt of \$4500 paid to The Villages, and also worked on overhauling and enhancing our rules and regulations and finance processes. As the Architectural Committee Chairman, I was involved in streamlining procedures, computerizing resident/lot files, and simplifying the RFC process. 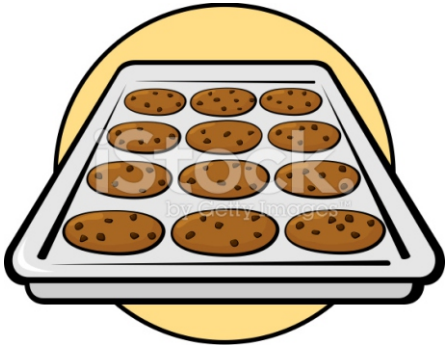

Kitchen Open House after June Board of Directors Meeting



Many people have asked to see the kitchen remodel that occurred last fall during the COVID closure. The Kitchen and Rec Committees would like to invite you to tour the kitchen after The Board Meeting on June 17. We will be serving cookies, lemonade, ice tea and decaf coffee.

All the countertops are now stainless steel, the convection oven was calibrated, and the original double-electric ovens were replaced with new convection ovens. A new hand sink was created, the home dishwasher was removed since it was not in the commercial code, and a new four compartment sink was fabricated that allows washing the large pans used in the kitchen. The Woodshop installed a new shelf to hold the coffee makers, removed the old cash drawer, and hung a door under the new sink. We would like to thank all the people that helped make this happen and show it off to the Village community.

RECYCLING in THE VILLAGES

Some residents expressed interest in recycling here at The Villages. A team of residents (MaryAnn Schulte, Brigitte Walsh, and Doug Keeler) did some research. Here is a summary.

Aluminum Cans (soda and beer cans only)

The Recreation Committee has a special container near the dumpster for the collection and recycling of aluminum cans **ONLY. They request that nothing else go into this bin.** If you would like to support the Recreation Committee, they appreciate your contributions. Proceeds from this recycling are used to help fund some of our events sponsored by the Recreation Committee.

Newspapers

There is a special bin near the dumpster provided by the local Lions Club to collect newspapers for recycling. Also magazines, junk mail, and scrap paper are acceptable. (For security, you may want to remove or black out your name on any material.) **They request that nothing else go into the bin.** A Lions Club member advised that if it can go through a simple paper shredder, then it would be okay to place it in the bin. If you would like to support this organization in their mission to serve our community, they appreciate your contributions. Funds from this recycling are used to support local schools and local non-profit organizations, such as Prescott People Who Care.

If you do not want to sort these recyclable materials to support our Recreation Committee and/or the Lions Club, then put them in the dumpster, so as not to cause extra work for these groups.

Dumpster Recyclables

Our dumpster is currently picked up by Patriot Disposal. Trash and recyclable materials are collected and then taken to their facility for sorting. Recyclable materials include cardboard, cans, glass, metal, and plastics. Kay at Patriot Disposal said that their employees open all bags to separate out the recyclable items. She indicated that the video on their website is outdated, but if you would like to see how the sorting is done, you may call them (928-775-9000) to schedule a tour that takes about a half hour. Kay also advised that if our community would want a separate container just for recyclables, it would cost about \$130 per month, and probably not accomplish much more than what happens currently. 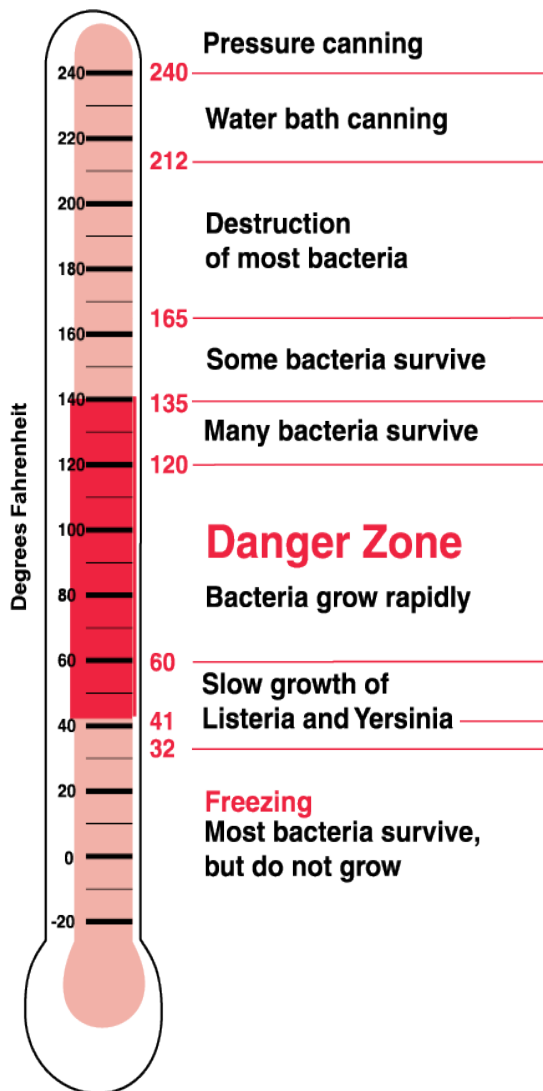

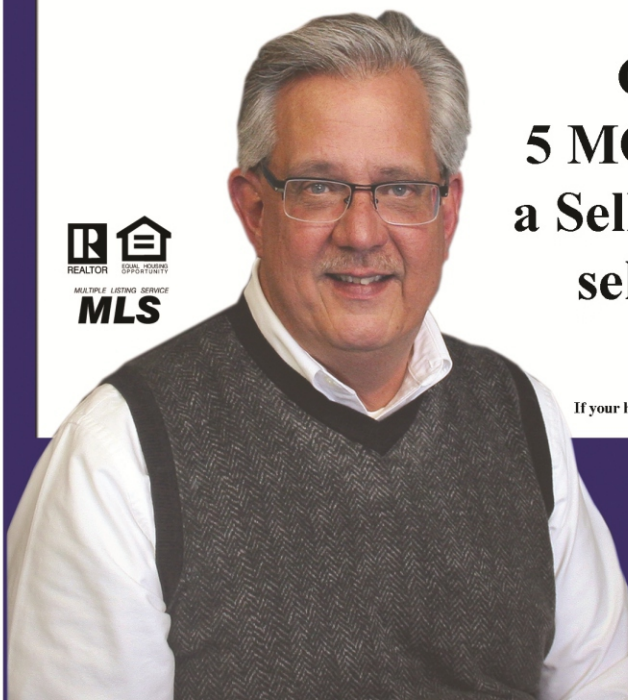

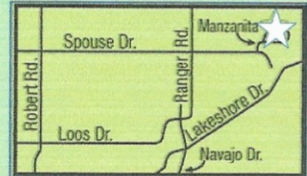
