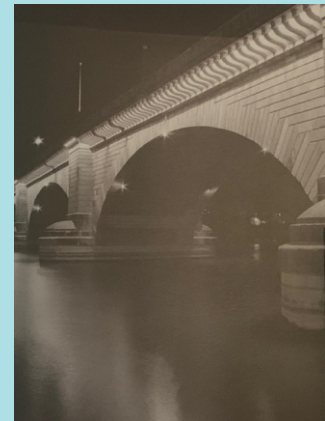

- July 14 Annual Meeting and Election of Directors/Officers. The final deadline for returning ballots to The Villages' office is July 14th at 11:00 A.M. Ballots will be counted beginning at 11:30 A.M. until completed by the Election Committee Ballot-counting Team. The Annual Meeting will begin at 2:00 P.M. in the Social Hall. The election results will be announced at the meeting.

**CANDIDATE ELIGIBILITY:** Per The Villages at Lynx Creek Owners Association By-Laws, Article VI, Section 2: To be eligible as a candidate, a person must be an Owner in good standing for not less than twelve (12) months immediately preceding the close of the application period and be in physical residence not less than six (6) months of the twelve (12) months preceding the close of the application period. ## ***What do the monitors do?***

The monitors are responsible for locking and unlocking all the doors and gates, patrolling the park looking for anything out of the ordinary and making notes of possible violations. Most importantly, making sure the streets are clear for Emergency Vehicles. **Reminder:** There is no over-night parking on any of the streets in the park. The streets must be clear for Emergency Vehicles.

## ***From the Board:***

The monitors do not do police work. They are not security guards. If you have an emergency or see a crime in progress, immediately call 911. If you see something that requires police involvement but is not an emergency, call the Prescott Valley Police Department Non-emergency Phone Number 928-772-9261

Beginning next month, a Monitor Schedule will be included in the Crier.

Please don't call the Monitors with a question the office, or a Board member can answer. The rules the monitors are asked to enforce are available online or in the office. The monitors do not have all the answers, but will try and get those answers as soon as possible!

## ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE NEWS

### “Changes On The Committee’”

The Board of Directors has commissioned the Paint Committee and the Architectural Committee to establish a list of acceptable paint colors for the exterior of our homes. After many weeks of research, including discussions with the local paint companies, the Paint Committee has developed a list of colors that are fully accepted. This list is available to our home owners, and may be picked up at the front office. This is very important! The Architectural Committee has been commissioned to approve paint requests according to the Color List only. If you decide to paint the exterior of your home with a color that is NOT on the list, your Request For Change (RFC) will be denied. Should you go ahead with a denied color; the Board of Directors will have to charge you with a fine. The Color List is actually a list of about 400 lot numbers of ACCEPTABLE paint colors (including the trim).

So, on the RFC, all you need to do is to tell us that you want to paint your house with colors like those on Lot #\_ \_\_. You do not need a paint swatch or paint-stick sample. If you need to know the paint numbers of those colors for ordering your paint, we have the ability to get those numbers for you. We cannot allow “mix & match”; for example, you cannot choose house color on one lot and the trim color on another lot. Ok, so, what if you want a color that IS NOT on the Color List? Any Committee decisions to deny an RFC may be taken to the Board of Directors to request a variance. A written request for a variance, with pertinent information about the paint, may be submitted at the front office. We understand that there will be questions for clarification. Please feel free to call Steve Breyer, Al Myers, or Gary Mincy on weekdays from 9 AM to 5 PM (See your Villages Directory for phone numbers).

# RECYCLING in THE VILLAGES

Some residents expressed interest in recycling here at The Villages. A team of residents (MaryAnn Schulte, Brigitte Walsh, and Doug Keeler) did some research. Here is a summary.

## **Aluminum Cans (soda and beer cans only)**

The Recreation Committee has a special container near the dumpster for the collection and recycling of aluminum cans **ONLY. They request that nothing else go into this bin.** If you would like to support the Recreation Committee, they appreciate your contributions. Proceeds from this recycling are used to help fund some of our events sponsored by the Recreation Committee.

## **Newspapers**

There is a special bin near the dumpster provided by the local Lions Club to collect newspapers for recycling. Also magazines, junk mail, and scrap paper are acceptable. (For security, you may want to remove or black out your name on any material.) **They request that nothing else go into the bin.** A Lions Club member advised that if it can go through a simple paper shredder, then it would be okay to place it in the bin. If you would like to support this organization in their mission to serve our community, they appreciate your contributions. Funds from this recycling are used to support local schools and local non-profit organizations, such as Prescott People Who Care.

### **Dumpster Recyclables**

Our dumpster is currently picked up by Patriot Disposal. Trash and recyclable materials are collected and then taken to their facility for sorting. Recyclable materials include cardboard, cans, glass, metal, and plastics. Kay at Patriot Disposal said that their employees open all bags to separate out the recyclable items. She indicated that the video on their website is outdated, but if you would like to see how the sorting is done, you may call them (928-775-9000) to schedule a tour that takes about a half hour. Kay also advised that if our community would want a separate container just for recyclables, it would cost about \$130 per month, and probably not accomplish much more than what happens currently.
