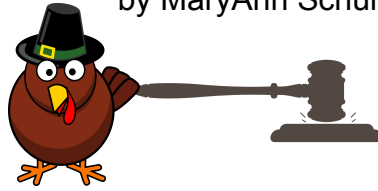

NOTES FROM THE BOARD

A special meeting to present and discuss the proposed budget for 2022 will be held in the Social Hall on **Monday, November 15, at 2:30 p.m.** All owners are encouraged to attend and give your input on this important matter.

The regular HOA Meeting will take place in the Social Hall on **Thursday, November 18, at 2:30 p.m.** All owners are invited to attend.

At the September HOA meetings, there were many topics of discussion:

- The Social Hall floor will be repaired, sanded, and refinished. The Social Hall will be closed from October 23 to November 10 for this project.
- The damaged poles and fencing near the tennis/pickleball court will be replaced soon.
- A new electronic card key system will be installed to replace the metal key/locks at the main entry points to the Rec Center. A card key will also be required to use the dumpster. Watch for more details coming via email and/or robocall.
- Closing costs for transfer fee, disclosure fee, and asset preservation fee were raised, in order to keep up with increases in employee salaries to perform new owner functions, and also to offset the rising costs of repairing and replacing our community assets, in addition to adding new assets.
- A new security camera system will be implemented soon. The new cameras are motion-activated, so that review of footage will be much simpler and faster.
- An answering service will soon take phone calls to report water leaks after hours and on weekends and holidays.
- The Reddy Ice machine has been removed. Instead, a freezer was donated to the kitchen, so ice will be bought from other sources and stored in the freezer until needed by the Recreation Committee. No more retail sales of ice for individuals.

If you have any suggestions for the board to consider, we request that you contact the office or any board member. We appreciate your ideas about our community.

CC&R HIGHLIGHTS

TRAFFIC RULES in THE VILLAGES



Rules and Regulations

20. **Traffic:** The speed limit throughout The Villages is 10 mph. This is to be observed at all times. Pedestrians, bicycles and golf carts have the right of way over automobiles. Keep all vehicles on roadways.
21. **Bicycles:** All bicycles in the common area must be parked only in those spaces provided. Riders must obey all Villages speed regulations and stop signs.
22. **Motorcycles/Mopeds and Golf Carts** (collectively "Carts"): All carts must obey the speed limit. Hand signals are required for indicating turns and stopping. All Cart operators must be 16 year of age or older or be accompanied by a licensed adult resident who shall be responsible for their actions.
23. **Unlicensed or Off Road Vehicles:** With the exception of golf carts or Villages owned maintenance vehicles, unlicensed or off-road vehicles are not permitted to operate on Village's streets.

Rules of the Road for Biking Safely (per NHTSA - National Highway Traffic Safety Administration)

- ✓ Ride in a straight line, single file.
- ✓ Go with the traffic flow. Ride on the right in the same direction as cars.
- ✓ Obey all traffic signs and signals.
- ✓ Ride with both hands on the handlebars except when signaling a turn or stop.
- ✓ Stop and look left-right-left for traffic before entering a street.
- ✓ Walk your bike across an intersection.
- ✓ Stay alert – use your eyes to look for things that could make you fall, like potholes, cracks, pebbles, or wet leaves.
- ✓ Stay alert – use your ears to listen for traffic. Don't wear earphones while riding.
- ✓ Watch for parked cars and cars pulling out or into parking spaces or driveways.
- ✓ Check your equipment. Make sure your bike tires are properly inflated and that the brakes work.

Bikers should always wear a helmet that fits level on the head and low on the forehead — one or two finger-widths above your eyebrow. Also, be sure to adjust the slider on both side straps to form a "V" shape under, and slightly in front of, the ears. Lock the slider if possible.

Rules of the Road for Pedestrian Safely (per NHTSA - National Highway Traffic Safety Administration)

- ✓ Be predictable. Follow the rules of the road, and obey signs and signals.
- ✓ Walk on sidewalks whenever they are available.
- ✓ If there is no sidewalk, walk facing traffic, and as far from traffic as possible.
- ✓ Keep alert at all times. Don't be distracted by electronic devices that take your eyes and ears off the road.
- ✓ Whenever possible, cross streets at crosswalks or intersections, where drivers expect pedestrians. Look for cars in all directions, including those turning left or right..
- ✓ If a crosswalk or intersection is not available, locate a well-lit area where you have the best view of traffic. Wait for a gap in traffic that allows enough time to cross safely; continue watching for traffic as you cross.
- ✓ Never assume that a driver sees you. Make eye contact with drivers as they approach to make sure you are seen.
- ✓ Be visible at all times. Wear bright clothing during the day, and at night wear reflective materials or use a flashlight.
- ✓ Watch for cars entering or exiting driveways, or backing up in parking lots.

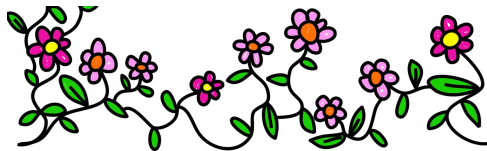
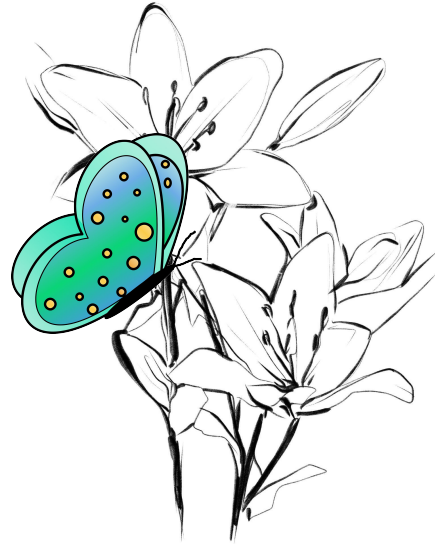

Architectural Committee News

During the month of September, 2021, the Architectural Committee received 33 requests for change (RFC's). Most requests were for new roofs or shingle replacements. The remainder were mostly for landscaping work. Our average response time from receipt of RFC to permit issuance was 3-4 days.

We have noticed that some homeowners were not filling out the forms correctly or fully. The major problem we have seen is that the homeowner has not adequately described the project or has not signed the form on page 2.

Another problem we have encountered is "lost" permits. This may be due to the extended time required from permit issuance to the date the work actually is completed. We think this may be due to the COVID-related contractor and material shortage.

Please remember to return your completed permit to the community office as soon as the job is completed.

November has arrived bringing cooler weather, falling leaves, and family activities. The Veterans' Day program and dinner will give us a chance to thank our Veterans' for their service. Joe Cannizzaro always gives us a very meaningful program.

10 Digit Dialing

July 16, 2020, the Federal Communications Commission adopted rules to establish 988 as the new, nationwide, three-digit phone number for **Americans in crisis to connect with suicide prevention and mental health crisis counselors. As of Oct. 24, 2021, Arizona will adopt 10-digit dialing.** That means all of Arizona will need to dial the area code + telephone number or 1 + area code + telephone number to place calls.

What will remain the same?

- Your telephone number, including current area code
- The price of a call, coverage area, or other rates and services
- What is a local call now will remain a local call without the area code
- Continue to dial 1 + area code + telephone number for all long-distance calls.
- You can still dial just three digits to reach 911 (emergency services) and 711 (relay services), as well as 211, 311, 411, 511, 611, or 811 where those services are available in your community.
- The National Suicide Prevention Lifeline can still be reached by dialing 1-800-273-TALK (8255).

ROBOCalls

The Villages Robocalls come in from an Oklahoma based company with area code 405. A number of residents have told us that they do not receive the Robocalls even though we have their phone number listed as receiving them. Please put **405-548-2251** in your phone and list it as Villages Robocall. The only way the office can notify all residences of water outages, Weekly Reminders, and anything else is through Robocalls. You just need to be sure the office has your number.

If you are renting, please make sure YOUR phone number is listed to receive the Robocalls as well.

Many residents receive information from the Office and the Board of Directors through email. If you have email and are not presently receiving any info, please call the office and give them your email address.

If you have any questions, please give the office a call at 928-772-7047 and we will be very happy to answer them.
