CC&R Highlights KEEP THE VILLAGES BEAUTIFUL



Here we are in the new year – it's a good time to take a look at your property to make sure that it is well-maintained. Is your landscaping trimmed appropriately? Have you removed all of the fallen leaves in your yard? Is your yard equipment and other miscellaneous items stored away, so that it is not visible to any other residents? Are only chairs, tables, benches, and a grill able to be seen by others? Are you being a good neighbor by not having unreasonable noises, odors, or bright lights? Are there no signs in your front yard?

We all want to live in a community that is pleasant, orderly, and clean. Let's each do our part to keep The Villages beautiful.

CC&Rs

- **7.2 Lots.** Each Owner of a Lot shall be responsible for maintaining, repairing or replacing on the Lot all buildings, Residential Units, landscaping or other Improvements situated thereon, except for any portion of the Lot which is an Area of Association Responsibility. All buildings, Residential Units, landscaping and other Improvements shall at all times be kept in good condition and repair. All grass, hedges, shrubs, vines and plants of any type on a Lot shall be irrigated, mowed, trimmed and cut at regular intervals so as to be maintained in a neat and attractive manner. Trees, shrubs, vines, plants and grass which die shall be promptly removed and replaced with living foliage of like kind, unless of a prohibited species or kind, or for a different foliage is approved in writing by the Architectural Committee. No yard equipment, wood piles or storage area may be maintained so as to be visible from neighboring property or streets.
 - 3.5.1 Items placed or stored under any RV, Park Model or M/M (modular or mobile home) occupying a Lot shall not be visible. Occupants must keep their Lot and the RV, Park Model or M/M in a clean and orderly condition and in a good state of repair. No personal property may remain where it can be seen by others in the area, except for tables, benches, chairs and grills.
 - 3.5.5 Unless expressly permitted by the Architectural Committee, exterior additions or attachments to the top, rear, front, side or underneath of an RV, Park Model or M/M facility are prohibited except for satellite dishes and sky light covers.
 - 3.5.9 No Lot Owner shall permit or cause anything to be done, kept or remain in or on his Lot which will increase the cost of insurance on the Association, or which will obstruct or interfere with the rights of other Lot Owners, or annoy them by unreasonable noises, odors or intrusive lighting.

- 3.5.11 No owner or real estate agency sign(s) including "For Sale", "For Lease", "Yard Sale", or other similar signs may be placed on a Lot, posted inside or outside a dwelling unit or in any common area, except in conformance with the Board of Directors sign policy and/or appropriate County or State Law Regulations.
- **3.7 Maintenance of Lawns and Plantings.** Each Owner of a Lot shall keep all shrubs, trees, hedges, grass and plantings of every kind located on (i) his Lot, (ii) any public right-of-way or easement area which abuts or adjoins the Owners Lot and which is located between the boundary line of his Lot and the paved area of any street, sidewalk, bike path or similar area, and (iii) any non-street public right-of-way or easement area adjacent to his Lot, neatly trimmed, and shall keep all such areas properly cultivated and free of trash, weeds and other unsightly material.
 - **3.8 Nuisances.** No rubbish or debris of any kind shall be placed. or permitted to accumulate upon or adjacent to any Lot or other property, and no odors, loud noises or bright lights shall be permitted to arise or emit there from, so as to render any such property or any portion thereof, or activity thereon, unsanitary, unsightly, offensive or detrimental to any other Property in the vicinity thereof or to the occupants of such other property. No other nuisance shall be permitted to exist or operate upon any Lot or other property so as to be offensive or detrimental to any other property in the vicinity thereof or to its occupants.

Architectural Committee Rules


Landscaping. No shrubs or trees are to be planted in rear or side yards which, when mature, will encroach onto a neighboring lot and/or public right-of-way. Limbs or other parts of an existing tree or shrub which encroach onto a neighboring lot must be removed if requested by the neighboring lot owner. Any shrubs or trees overhanging or encroaching on the public right-of-way must be maintained from the ground level of fourteen (14) feet. This meets the fire truck clearance when the Fire Department services our community.

The Architecture Committee 2021 The Year in Review



2021 has been a year of change for the Architecture Committee. We have new rules approved by the HOA Board of Directors in November, new Architecture Committee procedures and faster approval of homeowner Requests for Change.

The New AC Rules

If you do not have a copy of the new rules, be sure to pick one up in the Community Office when you start considering any change to the exterior appearance of your property. Even if you aren't contemplating a project now please take the time to read at least the first two pages of the rules. They describe our mission in serving you to accomplish your home improvement objectives and your responsibilities as a homeowner in the Villages and the Architectural Committee operation rules.

New AC Procedures

The AC Committee made a decision this summer to act on a Request for Change immediately upon receipt while continuing having open meetings for homeowners on the third Wednesday each month. By contacting homeowners within a day or two after receiving an RFC approval time has been shortened to a day or two for the majority of the RFC's, not two weeks. Attendance at the open meetings has dropped to zero. As a result of the positive response from homeowners we plan to have only one meeting for the community beginning the third Wednesday of the month in January for anyone to attend to ask any question about the AC Rules as it may relate to any planned project they may be considering. As stated in the AC Mission, we are here to help homeowners accomplish the home improvement goals.
