

MANAGER'S REPORT

May 2022

Accomplishment in May-June

- The Finance Committee met and reviewed the May bank reconciliations.
- The audit is complete and has been distributed to the Board and the Finance Committee
- Asphalt repair was need on the Southwest side of the parking lot by the mailboxes. That is completed and the asphalt will be restriped and the yellow striping will be completed.
- The contract for the new fencing for the new dog play area will begin soon
- The following projects are still on the schedule: plans to move the horseshoe pit inside the pool area., sprucing up the monuments at the entrance to the Villages and repair and repainting, trimming of Association trees.
- The key card system has been implemented and all residents who have requested key cards have been accommodated.
- Some other pertinent information:
- In calendar year 2021, we were able to increase our total monetary assets by approximately \$130,000.
- To date in 2022, we have increased our total monetary assets by approximately \$55,000.
- The Asset Preservation Fee and HOA Disclosure/Transfer Fees are up approximately \$37,000 over last year.

Only one ballot per lot is allowed. An owner may not vote on behalf of the owner of a different lot. According to our Bylaws, write-in candidates are not permitted. Also, proxy votes are not accepted, and cumulative voting is not allowed. Please do not make any comments or notes on the ballot.

After completing your ballot, place it inside the return envelope provided. Do not sign the ballot itself. On the return envelope, please include your name, address, and your signature.

Your ballot will be disqualified in these situations:

- -you vote for more than two candidates.
- -you vote more than once for the same candidate on the same ballot.
- -you vote for a candidate who is not listed on the ballot.
- -you make any comments or notes or other marks on the ballot.
- -you do not include your name, address, and signature on the outside envelope.

You may return it to the HOA office in person or by mail. Only ballots received on or before 11:00 a.m. on Tuesday, July 12, will be counted. As an alternative, you may vote in person at the annual meeting.





Ladies and gentlemen, we hope to see you at the woodshop




