

Notes from the Board

MaryAnn Schulte

The next HOA meeting will be held on Thursday, June 16, in the Social Hall at 2:30 p.m. There will be updates on current projects and discussion of new business.

Another special event this month will be the "Meet the Candidates" forum on Thursday, June 9, at 2:00 p.m. in the Social Hall. At this time, residents will be able to ask questions and give their comments to the candidates for the Board of Directors election.

For this election, we would like to encourage you to pick up your ballots in person at the HOA office. Please bring your card key or some other official identification. Only one ballot per lot is allowed. You will not be able to obtain a ballot for the owner of another lot.

Ballots that are not picked up by mid-June will be mailed to the address of record per the HOA office. Make sure that your mailing address is current to avoid any delay in receiving your ballot.

Please take the opportunity to vote for up to two (2) names on the ballot. You may vote for only one candidate or none of the candidates – just return your ballot.

According to our Bylaws, write-in candidates are not permitted, proxy votes are not accepted, and cumulative voting is not allowed. An owner may not vote on behalf of the owner of a different lot.

After completing your ballot, place it inside the return envelope provided. Do not sign the ballot itself. On the return envelope, please include your name, address, and your signature.

Your ballot will be disqualified in these situations:

- -you vote for more than two candidates.
- -you vote more than once for the same candidate on the same ballot.
- -you vote for a candidate who is not listed on the ballot.
- -you make any comments or notes or other marks on the ballot.
- -you do not include your name, address, and signature on the outside envelope.

You may return your ballot to the HOA office in person or by mail. Only ballots received on or before 11:00 a.m. on Tuesday, July 12, will be counted. As an alternative, you may vote in person during the annual meeting on July 12 at 2:00 p.m.

Please return your ballot properly in order to establish a quorum, and avoid the need to call for another election. A quorum of 25% of owners is required for a valid election, according to our CC&Rs. Thank you for your cooperation.

2022 BOARD OF DIRECTORS ELECTION SCHEDULE

May 1 Candidate Applications will be available at the HOA office. If you would like an application to be emailed to you, please contact Jeanine or Gail at 928-772-7047. (See below for Candidate Eligibility.)

May 13 Deadline (Close of the Application Period) to return completed Candidate Applications to the HOA office, and given to a member of the office staff during their normal business hours. Eligible candidate names and resumes will be published in the June Crier.

June 9 at 2:00 p.m. The Nominating Committee will host a "Meet the Candidates" forum, so that residents may ask questions directly to the candidates.

June 1-13 Voting ballots are available at the HOA office during regular business hours for owners to pick up in person. You must wear your card key or show other identification indicating your lot number — only one ballot per lot. You may not obtain the ballot for any other homeowner. Please read and follow the instructions included with your ballot, so that your ballot will not be disqualified. After completing your ballot, you may return it to the HOA office in person or send it via regular mail. We urge you to pick up your ballot and return it in person, in order to save on mailing expense, and also to assure that it is received by the deadline.

June 14 The notice of the 2022 Annual Meeting and any remaining ballots not picked up in person will be mailed out to owners at their address of record. Make sure that our HOA records include your correct mailing address for you to receive your ballot timely.

July 12 The Annual Meeting will begin at 2:00 p.m. Ballots received at the HOA office on or before 11:00 a.m. will be counted beginning at 11:30 a.m. until completed by the ballot-counting team of volunteers. Meeting attendees will have an opportunity to submit their ballot, if they have not already done so. The results of the election will be announced at this meeting.

CANDIDATE ELIGIBILITY Per The Villages at Lynx Creek Owners Association Bylaws, Article VI, Section 2: "To be eligible as a candidate, a person must be an Owner in good standing for not less than twelve (12) months immediately preceding the close of the application period and be in physical residence not less than six (6) of the twelve (12) months preceding the close of the application period. Previous interrupted Ownership and/or residency or rental shall not apply toward this requirement."

The phrase "in good standing" means that the owner is not more than thirty days in arrears in their monthly assessment and has not had their HOA membership suspended.

May has become a very busy month with home owners taking on a variety of projects including painting the house, landscaping, new driveways, necessary repairs and removal of dead trees. Make sure you review the Architectural rules as you make plans for your projects.

Here are a few things to consider:

Painting: <u>Make sure your home lot number is on the approved list of paint</u> combinations available in the office. The same holds true if you want to change colors. Landscape: Page 7 of the Architectural Rules available in the covers almost everything you need to know about the subject, including dead trees and new trees. There are some trees not allowed. Call one of us if you need help.

Repairs: Some require a Request for Change and some don't. If it's something minor like touch up painting, replacing a rotted board, dead limbs or other minor repairs probably not. If in doubt, call us or send in an RFC.

- The Finance Committee met and reviewed the April bank reconciliations. The books have been sent to the auditor and should be ready by the end of May.
- The red curbs have been repainted.
- The common area lawns have been redone.
- The following projects are still on the schedule: fencing upgrade for the former horseshoe pit and plans to move the horseshoe pit inside the pool area, sprucing up the monuments at the entrance to the Villages, and repair and repainting, possible resurfacing the parking lot, trimming of Association trees.
