ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE

Fall is quickly approaching and several thoughts that comes to mind.

"Fall is also a good time to plant a tree. I love the shade. What kind of tree should I buy."

"All of those darned leaves are going to start falling and I'm going to have to rack them up and I don't even have a tree on my lot."

"My neighbor's tree has limbs growing into my lot which are a problem." And the list goes on.

Trees are a great for the community but there also problems. The Architecture rules offer some guidance that can help you make a good decision about the type of tree, where to plant them and what else should be considered. Page 7 of the AC Rules on landscaping addresses the Rules on trees. Here are some of the important parts to keep in mind.

*The following trees are **NOT PERMITTED** in The Villages because of excessive leaf drop, size, water requirements and/or affinity for sewer lines: Cottonwood, Willow, Maple, Arizona Cyprus, Raywood Ash and Sycamore For all other trees, the home owner should be prepared to demonstrate the appropriateness of the tree they choose.*

No shrubs or trees are to be planted in rear or side yards which, when mature, will encroach onto a neighboring lot and/or public right-of-way. Limbs or other parts of an existing tree or shrub which encroach onto a neighboring lot must be removed if Requested by the neighboring lot owner.

The location of all trees, shrubs or bushes that an owner wishes to plant near a street or driveway must be approved by the Architectural Committee. No tree or tall shrub may be planted within 15 feet of a street intersection or driveway in order to prevent vehicular traffic obstruction of view. Any trees or shrubs which currently present a safety hazard must be cut back or removed.

ROOM RESERVATION PROCEDURE

Room Reservations for those wanting to have a continuous event, the reservation requests will be in the Activity Room for your completion. These must be turned into the office by October 12th, 2022. The request will include the name of the event, i.e., line dancing, rehearsal dates, etc. also, the days, the times and the months being requested. If there is a dual request for the same time and place first come takes priority but hopefully the two parties will compromise so that both activities can be scheduled.

This request, when turned into the office will be time and date stamped. The Recreation Committee will then approve and then the event will be sent to the office for addition to the master office calendar.

Those who are requesting a day for a single event, i.e., dinners, dances will check with the office to see if that time is available. If there is an event already approved, the person handling the special event will call the person in charge of the existing activity to see if they are willing to allow the special event to take place and their activity will not participate on that date. When the room reservation is completed and turned into the office, the information will include the name of the existing event chairman who was contacted and has agreed to the change for that one time. The request will be date and time stamped by the office and a copy returned to you for your records. This request will be approved by the President of the Recreation Committee and then given to the committee in charge of the room reservations.
