

Permit me to introduce you to **Stephanie Mahoney**, a gifted volunteer who generously leverages her education and experience to our benefit. She manages our kitchen with all the skill and aplomb of an accomplished chef, which she definitely is.

Stephanie is one of those rare "natives of the Southwest USA". Her Dad was a mining engineer in Jerome before moving to Silver City, New Mexico where Stephanie was born. When Stephanie was five years of age her family moved to Morenci, AZ where she took her elementary and senior



schooling. With a mining engineer Father and a career nurse Mother it is not surprising that Stephanie diligently pursued post secondary education... and she did so on Arizona University campuses.

Stephanie earned her B.A. from ASU and obtained her Masters in Home Economics and Health Education from Northern AZ State University. Her first job, at the tender age of 22, was in Ajo, AZ. Interestingly, through the kindness of fate, two of her Ajo students – Dolly Sotelo (now Mathis) and Annette Leppert (now Leon) – live in our community. Stephanie moved from Ajo to Prescott Valley in 1984 to teach Home Economics at a middle school

(near enough to The Villages at Lynx Creek that she was able to watch our community being built). In 1994 "Home Economics" expanded to become a broad vocational class incorporating multiple life skills Stephanie wholeheartedly embraced that evolution and became a "computers in the classroom" pioneer". In addition to the classic life skills they would need in "the real world" Stephanie taught her students to use Word. Excel and similar programs, as well as a photo and video editing application. She retired from that classroom in 2010. After spending a bit of time in Miami, FL acquiring some necessary credentials, she began teaching "How to Become a Chef" at what is now known as Mountain Institute CTED in Prescott. Graduates who transferred to Yavapai College were pleased to learn that Stephanie's classes were recognized as earned credits toward their continuing education. While at Mountain Institute she volunteered in the kitchen of the Coalition for Compassion and Justice. Working with Chef Brian she added catering experience to her resume by preparing meals for the First Friday Lunch in Prescott. In 2015 Stephanie accepted a cook's position at Spring Ridge Academy, a girls' school in Spring Valley, AZ where, working three and a half days each week, she prepared lunch and dinner for 70 students. This is when Stephanie really became "Chef Steph". Girls in their final semester were assigned to work with her in the kitchen. This was a job Stephanie TRULY LOVED because she was, in addition to teaching cooking, afforded the opportunity to once more teach critical life skills to young adults.

Stephanie moved into The Villages at Lynx Creek in mid 2017 (attracted by the water aerobics and our many other activities, she says). She immediately volunteered to help prepare the Christmas dinner only a few months later.

And the rest, as they say, is history.

As our interview drew to a close Stephanie offered a final personal comment, "It takes a village to make good things happen here and I really appreciate all the volunteers who pitch in."
