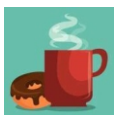

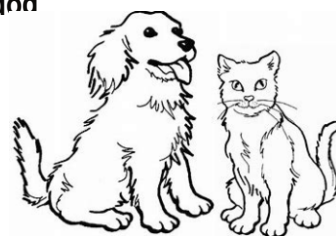

The Architectural Committee is comprised of seven members plus an Intern. Currently the position of Intern is open, and we are seeking to fulfill this position. If you would like to be on this Committee, please submit a short letter of intent including any experience that might relate to the work we do. Submit your letter to the Architectural Committee and leave it at the Front Office **before FEBRUARY 29, 2020**.

#### **KEEPING OUR COMMUNITY BEAUTIFUL:**

Well, here it is February 2020 already! Spring is just around the corner and many of us will be improving our landscaping, repairing homes, and generally making improvements to our homes and lots. Everyone benefits from our lot improvements, for it shows pride in our community and improves our property values.

**As a reminder**, as you plan your home improvement projects on the outside of your homes don't forget to submit an **RFC (“Request For Change”)** to the Architectural Committee (the RFCs are available at the Villages' office). **We will be glad to help you so that your plans are fulfilled and comply with the CC&Rs.** You may also need to get a **city permit** from the Town of Prescott Valley for some construction projects.

Don't forget to consider the **legal setbacks** from property lines, **and easements** – check your copy of the “*Architectural Committee Rules*” and the *CC&Rs Sect. 3*. Also, your **structures** (house, carport/garage, patio/deck and porch covers) may have a **total roof coverage of no more than 50% of your lot's square footage**.
