

When system dialog prompts, click **Open Zoom Meetings**.





If you have Zoom Client installed, launch meeting. Otherwise, download and run Zoom.


If you cannot download or run the application, join from your browser.


Your host


- may put you into the Waiting Room until they are ready to start

- may prevent you from joining before them
















Hosting a Zoom Meeting


Go to Zoom.us

2. CCleaner –


- a. Run Health Check, but not necessary to buy Pro
- b. Custom Clean: Analyze and Clean

3. Glary Utilities -

- a. Cleanup and Repair:
 - i. Run Disk Cleanup.
 - ii. Run Registry Repair
- b. Optimize & Improve:
 - i. Disk Defrag (HDD)
 - ii. Software Update (very useful)
 - 1. Download
 - 2. Manual
 - 3. "Open when done"
 - 4. Complete the install process

- 1. <u>SUPERAntiSpyware</u> Click "Scan this Computer" then "Quick Scan". (Browsers may need to be closed.) If it finds anything other than Adware Tracking Cookies, run it again as a "Complete Scan".
- Malwarebytes After opening, check under Scan Status. If Updates is not Current, click Update Now. Then Scan Now. If threats are found, you will have the option of removing, repairing or quarantining them. When complete, Finish and Close.
- 3. If either SUPERAntiSpyware or Malwarebytes find any abnormal files (other than adware tracking cookies found by SUPERAntiSpyware), both apps should be run again until both come back having found no abnormal files.

Let's take a look at these maintenance programs...



Let's look at each of these programs...

Computer Backup

- ✓ I started at Zoom and am now down to A Acronis.
- ✓ Acronis is the tool I use to back up my computers.
- ✓ It creates an exact image of everything. A restore to a new HD puts your system back to exactly the way it was at the time of the backup.
- ✓ Why do you need it?
 - > Your hard drive crashes (happened to me)
 - > A Window update hoses your operating system (happened to me)
 - > Your computer is infected with a (non-Covid) virus and you need to restore
 - ➤ You click on a link and someone encrypts your files and they ask for thousands of \$ ransom
- ✓ Acronis is not free: https://www.acronis.com/en-us/personal/buy-backup/
- ✓ It is a subscription, about \$50/yr. But it is worth the security and peace of mind.
- ✓ There are many other backup options, but just backing up your Documents folder is not enough.
 - > There are many other important files you would overlook.

Procedure:

- 1. Buy an external portable backup drive
 - Costco and Amazon have 2TB drives for around \$60
- 2. Keep it unplugged except when you need it
 - Keeps it safe in case of a virus
- 3. Back up every couple of weeks or so
