Password Managers

- Where do you store them?
 - I have a fantastic memory!
 - Or did
 - They're in a little "black" book --
 - with cross outs or writing I can't read
 - Sticky notes
 - In a Password Manager?
- Do you use one of these?
 - "11111111"
 - "12345678"
 - "password"
 - "qwerty"

A Password Manager does MORE than just store passwords

Payment types:

credit and debit number, expiration, 3-digit code

Secure notes:

- Modem and wi-fi passwords
- Software licenses
- Copy of vaccination record
- Health care/Prescription plan numbers
- Property tax assessor parcels
- Vehicle VIN numbers

Personal Information:

Names, Emails, Phone Numbers, Addresses

Identifications:

- Social Security Numbers
- Driver's License Numbers
- Passports
- Tax numbers

- A password manager can fill in forms with the above information.
- You can share specific information
 - with someone you trust!
 - My daughters have the master password to my password manager,
 - So if something happens to both of us, they can pay our bills,
 - Or order from Amazon!
- Managers can generate a password with a scrambled string of numbers, letters and characters
- They can tell you how strong your passwords are, or if reused.
- I use its "Dark Web Monitoring" service that warns me when an email has been leaked or information stolen
- It can create a VPN (Virtual Private Network) for use when I'm traveling.
 - Rather than use risky public wi-fi.

Okay, that's a summary of the capabilities and features of a password manager.
