Windows 10 Your Phone

Access your Android smartphone's text messages, photos, calls, notifications, and more, directly from your PC?

Microsoft's Your Phone app brings integration between Android and Windows, enabling users to share data between their phone and PC with ease.

Windows 10 Voice Recognition

Talk to your PC to navigate, launch applications, dictate text, and perform a slew of other tasks?

We will show you how to set up voice recognition.

You don't need to 'train' your PC to recognize your voice, it works the first time you use it.

Four Apps You Can't Do Without

Windows 10 Add a Quick Event

Quickly add events to your Microsoft calendar directly from your Taskbar -- without having to open the calendar at all.

Windows 10 Quick Assist

Quick Assist allows you to get help from someone with a Windows 10 machine or give someone assistance with their Win 10 computer.

How to set up Your Phone for Windows 10

Step 1. Download the *Your Phone Companion* app on your Android smartphone.

Note: Some Samsung smartphones may already have the Your Phone Companion (branded Link To Windows) preinstalled.


If so, to open the Your Phone Companion app, head to Settings > Advanced settings > Link to Windows and skip the next two steps.

Step 2. Open the *Your Phone Companion* app on your Android smartphone.

Step 3. Tap *Link your phone and PC* to begin the setup process.


Step 4.

Click on *Link your phone* and pc



Step 5:


Tap Sign in with Microsoft



Step 6:


Enter your Microsoft account email and password

Tap next



Step 7:


Tap Continue



Step 8:


You will now be prompted to allow multiple different permissions.

Tap allow for each popup that appears.




Step 9:

Tap Continue



Step 10:

On you PC, open the *Your Phone App*




Step 10:

On your Android smartphone, tap *Allow* to enable the connection between your PC and phone.

You can now begin enabling and configuring the different settings inside the Your Phone app on your PC and phone.

That's all there is to it!





Windows 10 Voice Dictation

Windows 10 includes a new voice-to-text feature.


Let's started with the experience!



If you have a microphone connected to your device, dictation will be enabled by default.

Access it by using the Windows key + H keyboard shortcut or


Clicking the microphone button on your touch screen.



When the voice dictation panel appears, and you see the microphone icon in blue, you can immediately start dictating.

You will need to speak the punctuation.


To dictate a symbol or letter, you'll need to use the "start spelling" command, and then speak the symbol or letter.

You'll need to say

Open quote microsoft sells software comma hardware comma and accessories period close quote.

Voice commands	Actions
Select "word"	Selects specific word or phrase
Select that	Selects recent dictation result
Select the "next three words" Select the "previous two paragraphs"	Selects multiple blocks of text
Start spelling Stop spelling	Enables and disables spelling mode
Clear selection Unselect that	Clear current selection
Delete that Strike that	Deletes recent dication result or selected text
Delete "word"	Deletes current word
Go after that Move after "word" Go to the end of "paragraph" Move to the end of that	Moves cursor to the first character after specified word or phrase

Go up to the previous "paragraph" Move back to the previous "word"	Moves cursor backwards to the beginning of the previous block of text
Go to the start of the "word"	Moves cursor to the first <u>character</u> before a specified word or phrase
Go before that Move to the start of that	Moves cursor to the start of a text block
Go down to the next "paragraph" Move forward to the next "word"	Moves cursor forward to the beginning of the next block of text
Go to the end of the "paragraph" Move to the end of the "word"	Moves cursor to the end of a text block
Press "key" Tap "key"	Supported keys: Tab, Enter, End, Home, Page up, Page down, Backspace, Delete

Wrapping things up

- Overall the experience using dictation on Windows 10 is good, but not perfect, as you may find it not very reliable all the time.
- For example, during my test, repeatedly saying "uppercase w" would keep on writing the words "uppercase" and "W."
- In addition, it's not capable of recognizing punctuations automatically.
- It's limited to users running the US English version of Windows 10.
- And despite the fact that you can use some of the Speech Recognition commands, you'll notice the absence of the commands to navigate the desktop or app using your voice.



Windows 10 Add a Quick Event

To create a calendar event or reminder quickly on Windows 10 version 1909 (November 2019 Update), use these steps:


Click the *time and date* button in the taskbar.

Select the date to schedule the new event from the calendar.



Click the Show agenda option in the bottom-right corner.


Under the *Today* section, start typing the event or reminder in the text box.



Click the drop-down menu on the right to select the calendar to save the new event.


Specify the start and end time of the event.

Specify the location (if applicable).



(Optional) Click the More details button to open the event using the Calendar app, which allows you to access more options and continue composing the event on a bigger canvas.

Click the Save button.

Quick Assist

Before allowing access ...


- Since this feature gives a person complete control over another's PC, you should only use it with someone you trust.
- If you are the person giving assistance, you need to use a Microsoft account.
- If you are receiving assistance, you don't have to be signed into a Microsoft account.
- As long as you're comfortable with allowing that person access to your Windows 10 PC, the following steps will get everything working.
- Quick Assist only works on Window 10 Computers.


It doesn't take long to get *Quick Assist* set up.

This is what it looks like if you are the one providing assistance.

If you're helping out Right-click the Start button,


Click Search





Type Quick Assist and press Enter on your keyboard

Click Give assistance



Quick Assist Microsoft Quick Assist enables two people to share a computer over a remote connection so that one person can help solve problems on the other person's computer. Get assistance


> Allow someone you trust to assist you by taking control of your computer




Type your Microsoft account username

Click Next



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


Type in your password

Click Sign in

You're then shown a six-digit code that must be shared with the person receiving assistance.

There are a couple of options you can click right in the window (like email), but you can relay the code any way you want.



If you're getting help


Once the other person has received the code, here's how to get things set up for the person receiving assistance.

Right-click the Start button

Click Search


Type *Quick Assist* and press *Enter* on your keyboard






Click Get assistance

Type the six-digit code you received from the person giving assistance







Click Submit

Click *Allow* as long as the name matches the person giving assistance.

The person giving assistance will now have a window open that shows the other person's desktop.






Once you have a working connection, the person offering assistance has a number of tools at their disposal.

To annotate both screens, click the *Annotate* button.

This allows the person giving assistance to draw directly on both screens using their mouse cursor.




To restart the other PC, click the *Restart* button.

The *Quick Assist* connection will pause


It will automatically re-open when the PC restarts and boots Windows.




To open the *Task Manager* on the other PC, *click* the *Task Manager* button.



To pause or stop the connection, click the *Pause* or *Stop* button. The connection can be resumed by hitting the *Play* button in the same spot.



If the person receiving assistance would like to stop the *Quick Assist*, they can click the X in the top-right corner of the small window on their screen.
