

## Three Things You Can Do on a MAC Computer Screenshots, Magnifying & Emojis

**1. Screenshots** - To take a screenshot on your computer of the full screen, press and hold **Shift, Command, and 3**. If you see a thumbnail in the corner of your screen, click it to edit the screenshot. Or wait for the screenshot to save to your desktop. For the snipping tool panel press **Cmd + Shift +5**.

### 2. Magnify everything on your screen

You can zoom in & out by tapping on you trackpad or using keyboard shortcuts. On your Mac, choose **Apple menu>System Settings**, click **Accessibility** in the sidebar, then click **Zoom** on the right. (You may need to scroll down.) You may need to find the Vision section & then click Zoom. Then adjust setting to your preferences.

**3. Emoji** Press **Fn-E** or **.-E**, or choose **Edit>Emoji & Symbols**. Click a character or symbol to add it to you text (or double-click it if the Character Viewer is expanded).
